Student does not need to be a graduate to earn a grade 10 and/or grade 11 stamp. • Grade 12 stamp – 2/3 based on academic component (course grades) and 1/3 based on a student’s Graduation Transition Standards as well as effort, work habits etc.) Student must be a graduate to earn a grade 12 stamp. • Redeemable at designated post-secondary institutions and approved Industry Training Authority (ITA) providers

<p>Recognizes academic achievement on Grade 12 Provincial Examinations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • \$1000 voucher for winners • \$2000 voucher for top 20 winners • Approximately 5000 students annually <p>Eligibility and Criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enrolled in public or Group 1, 2 or 4 independent school • Must be Canadian citizen or permanent resident • Must earn at least a “C-“ in English 12, TPC 12 or Francais langue premiere 12 • Based on three best exam scores (SMS calculations) • Must meet graduation requirements • May not receive both provincial and district scholarship • Redeemable at designated post-secondary institutions 	<p>Recognized academic achievement on Grade 12 Provincial Examinations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • \$1000 voucher for winners • \$2500 voucher for top 20 winners <p>Eligibility and Criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enrolled in public or Group 1, 2 or 4 independent school • Must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident • Must earn at least a “B” in English 12, or Francais langue premiere 12 • Based on three best provincial exam scores (86% or higher) • Must meet graduation requirements • May receive both the provincial and district scholarship as well as a passport award • Redeemable at designated post-secondary institutions and approved Industry Training Authority (ITA) providers
